### **95% OF ALL FUNDS TO OPPOSE MEASURE 1 COME FROM THE ABORTION INDUSTRY**

Out-of-state chapters of Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion provider, have contributed over \$1.3 million to date - 95% of all the funds opposing Measure 1.

Planned Parenthood, which has no clinic in North Dakota, does not care about helping babies to be born through IVF - they care about abortion. They oppose Measure 1 because it overturns a court ruling granting a virtually unlimited right to abortion under our state constitution.
